Quantitative and Qualitative Detail

Background: We have been coaching cricket in SEN & main stream Schools along with Anthony Postle. To promote SU Spinners cricket. The section was first started in Summer of 2010.

Aims and Objectives:

- To give quality coaching to SEN & main stream schools in curriculum time and after school clubs
- Create Strong links with the schools
- Develop all types of disability cricket
- Develop teams to play in a County wide competition
- To promote cricket and give guidance to children and parents to join club
- Approx 150 hours coaching in the first year between all schools
- Organise festivals within cluster and County

Achievements to Date:

Developed links with 6 SEN schools Sheffield

- 1 SEN school Rotherham
- 1 High school Rotherham

Run sessions in Curriculum timetable, after school clubs

- 80 Curriculum hours delivered
- 70 After school hours delivered
- 20 young people attending each session

Organised 2 outside festivals Kwik cricket , 1 indoor festival

- 8 teams attended the outdoor festivals
- 6 teams attended the indoor festivals
- 140 children attended the festivals

2 school teams achieved the final of YCB disability day festival in Leeds

Managed to recruit 6-8, 11-14 years old to join the club. 3 of these children were able to play in main stream junior cricket.

All coach's who work with the Spinners section are Level 2 qualified, they have attended numerous courses in their development of coaching disabilities.

The club do not coach visual impaired, We have a contact who is the Yorkshire coach for visual impaired team, that we can refer any candidates.

We have supported the Sheffield Association for disability Sport, who use the facilities at the club.

We have a successful grant bid, which is to deliver 6x1hour sessions in 4 schools in South Yorkshire area before Christmas.

We are looking to have recruited a squad of players, no age,sex restrictions, by the Spring of 2011.

This will give the club an opportunity to arrange some fixtures to get the players playing the game of cricket.

Hours will be increased this year through further support from chance to shine.

Headline Statistics:

- 150 hours of contact time in school delivering cricket coaching
- 8 schools received coaching
- 10 schools took part in a festival
- 200 young people activity took part in cricket activity
- 2 coaches fully qualified in the last year to aid disability development at the club.
- 6-8 young people with a disability are now club members
- 3 of these children are involved in main stream cricket
- Links with 3 other district disability development centres in SY
